The Free Church Movement's focus on liberty, local discernment, and direct access to God feels remarkably relevant today. People crave authenticity, agency, and connection – values Congregationalism has long championed. The challenge lies in translating these ideals into a form that resonates now.

Born from a willingness to break free from outdated forms, how could the Free Church tradition speak to our current moment? In a fragmented world, the covenants of Congregationalism offer a model of countercultural unity – not uniformity, but a shared reverence for Christ and mission.

How can we make this tangible in the towns, cities, and neighborhoods we serve? Perhaps it's reimagining how, or even where, church happens in order to meet people where they are, figuratively, but also literally, in everyday spaces like homes, coffee shops, and online.

It also may involve revitalizing our covenantal relationships to ensure they feel alive and dynamic and fostering deeper connections among churches through regional gatherings, shared projects, and virtual community. By reimagining church in this way, we can renew the spirit of the Free Church Movement, fostering deeper, more relevant connections with the communities we serve.

They introduce sustainable farming techniques and technologies to struggling farmers worldwide, empowering small-scale farming families to thrive. ECHO also equips Indigenous churches, pastors, and local schools with knowledge and skills to spread hope and improve their communities.

Word Alive Mission serves Western Ghana and the Ivory Coast, focusing on church planting, discipleship, leadership training, and community development. They also run an orphanage, provide health care, operate a nurse training school, and promote education through their grammar school, Bible college, and youth scholarships.
