THOUGHTS: INVITES AND VISITORS

How does your church invite potential visitors? Picture yourself walking into a new and unfamiliar space with people you don't know, unsure of their customs, wondering if you'll be accepted.

Does your church have a team ready to greet visitors in a non-intrusive, friendly way? One that offers to sit with them through the service, and accompany them to coffee afterward? What visitors are looking for is a place where they can encounter the Divine who they can put their trust and hope in, and experience genuine acceptance and love within your congregation.

Consider this: When Jesus traveled from village to village, he sent seventy disciples ahead of him to prepare the way – they were marketers, creating anticipation for his arrival among villagers who wanted to encounter, learn more about, and increase their trust in God. When Jesus arrived, the people were eager to hear from him because they had been made ready.

In the same way, how well do you prepare your church to receive guests? What more can you do to "advertise" the love of Jesus to those who may be unfamiliar with your church? What more can your church do to welcome visitors in a way that makes them feel both comfortable and connected to something greater?
